

## Dear fellow students, parents and faculty,

During the last month, the **Improvement team** has been split into 3 groups. The first group, responsible for the bike racks, has found bike racks that adhere to the group's budget and are in the process of being bought. The second group, responsible for the vegan/vegetarian options in the cafeteria, has created a list of alternative dishes. The final team is investigating the budget for transforming space outside the cafeteria and a proposal to the management is being written.

The **Leisure team** has started to advertise the art, and writing competition, which will start soon. Christmas Cards are currently being sold, and the proceeds will go to the well-being of the students. The cards were designed by the students of our school: Emmeline Kjellgren (S7 Swedish), Sophie Boberg (S4 Swedish), Giorgia Webers (S5 Italian) and Marie Lienemeyer (S5 German).

Different initiatives have been promoted by the **Public Relations team**, as well, such as the jumper logo competition and *13 Stars Newspaper* (an initiative of CoSup, where students from all European Schools can write articles). The team has continued working on prior projects such as the CDE website. Additionally they have started working on getting official school GIFs and promoting the different clubs of our school on Instagram.

Meanwhile the **Amnesty Committee** has been writing a proposal for the sale of candles, which will be called: "bougie classique rouge", "bougie classique arc-en-ciel" and "bougie en verre parfumé pomme cannelle".

The **Jumper team** have completed the logo competition and the winner is Eleana Melakis. There was also a second winner chosen for the front of the jumper - Kilian Biermann, it was not the team's goal to find a new front logo, but Kilian's design fit perfectly so they decided to use it. This year the team have decided to use 80% bio cotton in the hoodies, instead of 50% like the past years, to be more eco-friendly. The ordering for these jumper should start online in about two weeks if all goes to plan.

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
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In the meantime, several meetings have been organized by the **Mini CDE** online and in person with the class representatives of S1 and S2 as well as meetings with the conseillers of S1 and S2 to make sure that their issues are understood and dealt with.

The **Grand Debate team** has been doing more planning on how they're supposed to hold the Grand Debate with COVID-19 complication. They will soon be looking for volunteers to help out.

Two representatives took part in a CoSup (Conseil Superieure des Élèves) meeting on November 22nd and a Cosup PR meeting took place on November 28th. Two climate representatives, who will be working on bringing up climate related issues to the management, to make our school more sustainable, have also been chosen for CoSup. Other meetings that took place were with the EEB presidencies. In that meeting the presidents discussed events and improvements that could be done at the schools. The CDE is actively working on two boards with the management, staff and teachers: well-being, bring your own device and sexual harassment. The well-being board is focusing on long-term and short-term plans for the well-being of the pupils, their last meeting was on November 12th. While the sexual harassment advisory board are meeting every other Friday they are working on updating the dress code, adapting it to today's society and are attempting to organise a workshops on topics related to sexual harassment, like verbal harassment and toxic masculinity. The bring your own device advisory board has had a meeting on November 18th and a representative from the CDE attended the meeting.

Finally the CDE organised a workshop for S5 on November 23rd in the study room, where they asked the S7 students questions concerning exams.
