Privacy statement for Support to Academic research involving distribution of a questionnaire to pupils and their legal representatives

1. Description and purpose of the processing operation

A PhD student from Université Cergy-Pontoise/Université de Luxembourg has requested the assistance of EEB2 to distribute a questionnaire to a group of pupils' legal representatives concerning his research. The research concerns what should be the contents of European Schools history syllabi in order to understand the present, anticipate the future and create common ground based on the learning of a shared past. It addresses the question by analyzing archive documents and through anonymous interviews and questionnaires.

The questionnaire seeks to identify the opinions of the target audience – S6/S7 pupils and their legal representatives - about history as a school subject and the way it is taught in the European Schools. EEB2 will send a link provided by the researcher to S6/S7 pupils and their legal representatives. It is fully within their discretion to answer the questionnaire. If they choose to provide a reply, they will do so directly via the online platform (to which EEB2 will not have access). The researcher receives the answers through the online platform and cannot see either the names or the IP addresses of the survey respondents.

2. Legal basis for the processing

The legal basis for this processing operation is Article 6 paragraph (1)(a) (data subject's consent).

3. Categories of personal data collected

In order to carry out this processing operation, EEB2 collects the following categories of personal data of pupils: City of birth, country of birth, nationality, age, section, L2, length of time attending EEB2; and the following categories of personal data of the legal representatives: occupation and nationality, educational background, partner's nationality and occupation, number of children they have attending EEB2, length of time their children have been attending EEB2, sections and L2 of their children.

4. Who has access to your personal data and to whom is it disclosed?

The researcher/PhD candidate has access to the data that will be collected.

5. How do we protect and safeguard your personal data?

In order to protect your personal data, a number of technical and organisational measures have been put in place. Technical measures include appropriate actions to address online security, physical security, risk of data loss, alteration of data or unauthorised access, taking into consideration the risk presented by the processing and the nature of the data being processed. Organisational measures include restricting access to the data to authorised persons with a legitimate need to know for the purposes of this processing operation.

6. How long do we keep your personal data?

Your personal data may be retained until the researcher's PhD dissertation is written and defended, by the end of 2020.

7. What are your rights and how can you exercise them?

You have the right to request access to your personal data, rectification or erasure of the data, or restriction of the processing of your data. You have the right to object to the processing of your data as well as the right to data portability. If the legal basis for processing is your consent, you have the right to withdraw your consent at any time. (The withdrawal of consent will not affect the lawfulness of the

processing before the consent was withdrawn.) Any request to exercise one of these rights should be directed to the Controller (WOL-DP-CONTROLLER@eursc.eu).

You may contact the data protection officer (WOL-DPO-CORRESPONDENT@eursc.eu) with regard to all issues related to processing of your personal data and the exercise of your rights under Regulation (EU) 2016/679 or relevant Belgian national law.

8. Right of recourse

You have the right to have recourse to the Belgian Data Protection Authority (<https://www.autoriteprotectiondonnees.be/introduire-une-requ%C3%AAteune-plainte>) if you consider that your rights under Regulation (EU) 2016/679 or relevant Belgian national law have been infringed as a result of the processing of your personal data by EEB2.
