European School 2 - Evere site - Q/A

1) The EEB2-Evere site & Facilities

- Q: What is the precise address of the EEB2- Evere site:
 - A: Avenue du Bourget 30 1130 Bruxelles
- Q: Is the site provisional or definitive?
 - A: Provisional, at least until the delivery of EEB5 (approximately 2028).
- Q: What is the distance between the temporary school and the definite school? To know how much children will be affected by the construction of the permanent school...
 - A: Children will not be affected by it, there are buildings between the two sites. We however cannot guarantee that there will not be any other works in the surroundings.
- Q: Will it be possible for parents (and the kids) to visit the Evere site before September?
 - A: No
- Q: Is a virtual visit planned? If yes, When?
 - A: This is not foreseen.
- Q: What happens if the site is not ready in September? Will the kids be assigned to Woluwe or to all schools?
 - A: The plan B is the infrastructure rue Neerveld (very close to EEB2- Woluwe). Children will not be split.
- Q: What will the first week of the newcomers be like? Especially for the nursery 1 (M1). How is the adaptation and are the parents allowed to be there on the first day of school?
 - A: Please refer to the Nursery vademecum to be published before the summer break.
- Q: This site will have special security measures linked to this peculiar location?
 - A: All safety and security equipment will be top-quality and meet all security standards.
- Q: What about the radioactivity level of the ex-NATO site? Is there a measurement made, at least?
- A: It is up to the Belgian authority to guarantee the delivery of the school site in correct conditions.
- Q: There was a fire in the building a week ago. How does this affect the deadline?
 - A: The Belgian authority let us know that they will do all they can to ensure a timely delivery.
- Q: What about playgrounds and green areas?
 - A: There is a lot of space, separated for Nursery and Primary levels. Pedagogical and technical planification is ongoing.

2) Enrolments

Q: If we refuse the place, do we risk not to get a place at all? Or is there a chance to get accepted at a school closer by?

A: No, if you refuse the place, you lose it. There will be no place granted in another school for the 2021-2022 academic year.

Q: If parents refuse the place now, but would like to apply again next year?

A: Yes, you can apply next year according to the 2022-2023 policy that will be published in December 2021.

Q: Will transfer to Evere be preferential also next year?

A: We cannot say. This information will be known once the 2022-2023 policy is published in December 2021.

Q: If P1 EN section is for 2021 only, what happens in 2022?

A: The 2022-2023 policy will state the Transfer procedure.

Q: If we lodge an appeal, do we have to confirm the place in Evere first?

A: We advise you to accept the place first (if you refuse it, it is lost). If the appeal doesn't work you will still have the opportunity to finally refuse the place.

Q: What is the overall number of pupils?

A: We expect between 400-600 children for the next school year. The final number will be known after the 2nd phase of enrolment.

Q: Are there other language sections than FR, DE, EN and IT?

A: Not for the school year 2021-2022.

Q: If we accept a place we can still withdraw until end of August?

A: There is no withdrawal deadline, but please do so as soon as you can for the good organization of the school and its services.

2) Transportation, garderies, canteens, extracurricular activites.

Q: the Parents' association will be different from that of Woluwe?

A: No, there will be a single APEEE for the EEB2-Woluwe and Evere, and part of the team will be in charge of the Evere site.

Q: When will we be able to get info about the transport and its organization?

A: See website of APEEE.

Q: How will you ensure that parents in Evere will be involved in the organization of bus transport and activities?

A: We will involve parents of both sites in exactly the same way.

Q: Will there be sports facilities, courtyards and outdoor facilities from September on, or do you plan to send children to other locations by bus (for sports, swimming, etc.)?

A: Sports facilities inside for Nursery, P1-P2. P3-P5 will use NATO's sport facilities and swimming pool.

Q Is the use of NATO facilities a temporary or a permanent 'solution'?

A: This is a permanent solution.

Q: In which section/year the swimming pool activities starts?

A: P1

Q: Is there a bike lane to get to the school? Will it be possible to let one's bike there and take it back at the end of the day?

A: There is a bike lane and there will be bike parking facilities at school.

Q: Kids who eat sandwiches will eat in the same lunchroom as the rest of the kids?

A: This remains to decide.

3) Pedalogical aspect, section, courses

Q: In Nursery, is it 30 students with one teacher and one assistant?

A: From 26 pupils: 1 teacher + 1 full-time assistant. Between 16 and 25: 1 teacher + part-time assistant

Less than 16: 1 teacher

Q: What are the class sizes per section: Nursery and Primary?

A: Around 70 m²

Q: Do you use the syllabic or the global method or a mix for learning and writing?

Q: Can I know if there are any support for special need child? A child in the spectrum for example..

Q : Do you already have the teachers?

A: Yes, some teachers working at EEB2-Woluwe will be transferred to Evere, and we are in hiring process for the others.
