

STUDENTS MOBILITY PROGRAMME EEB2

The program allows S5 students the opportunity to go to another European School or Accredited European Schools for 4 months (from September until December) in their L1 section

Because of the overcrowding, we will only accept an equivalent number of students leaving and coming



REAL EXCHANGE

Your family hosts a pupil and your child is hosted by the pupil's family (or another family)

ONE WAY VISIT

Your child is hosted by a family abroad, but you don't host a pupil in return

Aim of the program

- Improve language skills
- Experience a different European culture

The pupil will continue their language section curriculum staying with a host family speaking their L2 or L3.



Who can apply?

All students in S4 (with good school results and appropriate behaviour) can apply for the Mobility programme that will take place in S5

SWALS students

If there is no L1 section in the host school, the student will be treated as a Student Without A Language Section (SWALS).

If a SWALS student finds a section of his/her L1 in the host school, the pupil will follow lessons in his/her L1 section.



What is the procedure?

Step 1

The initial request is a [Form](#) filled in by parents with basic information : languages, options, motivation,...

Deadline for receiving initial requests from parents: First week after Christmas holidays.

Step 2

This document will be presented to the **Class Council** of the sending school for the pre-selection of candidates. The preselected list of candidates has to be validated by the **School Management**.

The sending school will inform students who have not being pre-selected.

The sending school will send the list of the pre-selected students to the school chosen by the student.

Step 3

The sending school will ask pre-selected students to fill in Annex 2 (pupils' application), Annex 4 (health form. Part 1), Annex 5 (consent form).

Step 4

APEEE will help matching your child with a host family. However, parents may look for a host family themselves.

Step 5

The sending school will ask pre-selected students to fill in Annex 3 (host family info), Annex 4 (Part 2) and Annex 6

Step 6

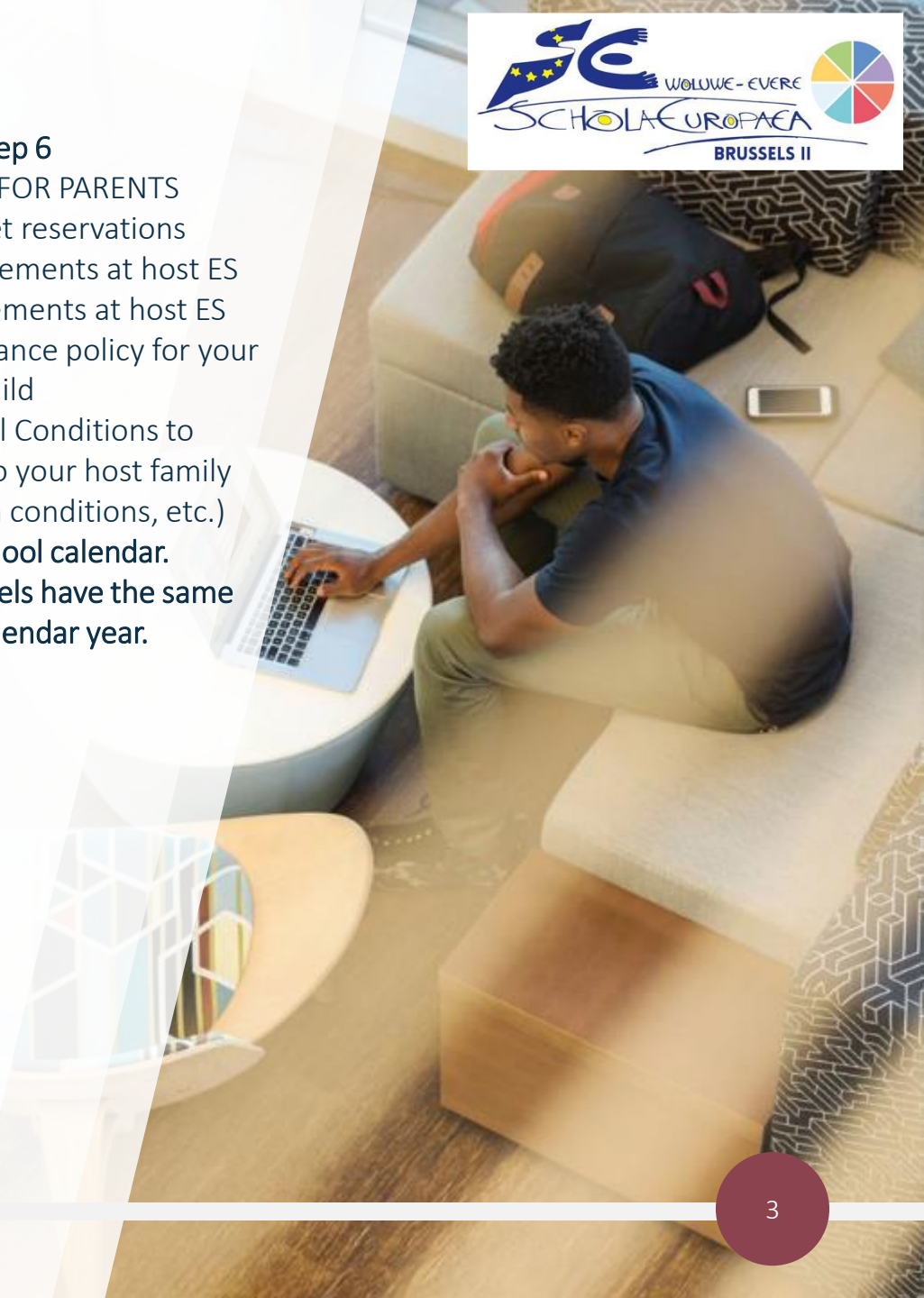

Only ES in Brussels have the same school calendar year.



Some important remarks

The student has to be mature enough

The student has to be able to catch up some lost subjects and be aware to study extra on subjects that she/he cannot follow in the host school

Parents and pupils have to do their part themselves

Neither the sending school nor the hosting school are responsible for arranging host families, travel, travel insurance, board and lodging or for any costs involved.

Finding a host family is often a big problem. It is an advantage if you know families in the area the student wants to go to.



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
